Treating the application for a stay and the briefs in opposition as a petition for a writ of certiorari and opposition thereto, certiorari is granted and the case is set for oral argument on Monday, January 11, 1971. Briefs for the petitioners shall be filed by December 21, 1970, and briefs for the respondents shall be filed by January 4, 1971. These briefs may be typewritten if counsel are unable to file printed briefs by these dates. The motions of the Committee of 100 on the Federal City, Inc.; and the City of Memphis et al., for leave to file briefs, as *amici curiae*, are granted.
